Students must complete a 6 hour sequence in either History or Literature.

Options for this sequence:

Eng 251 - American Literature I & Eng 252 - American Literature II
Eng 271 - World Literature I & Eng 272 - World Literature II
His 101 - Western Civilization I & His 102 - Western Civilization II
His 201 - United States History I & His 202 - United States History II

History and Literature classes may be taken in any order and you may also take both classes from your chosen sequence during the same semester.
