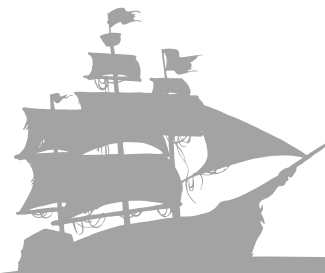

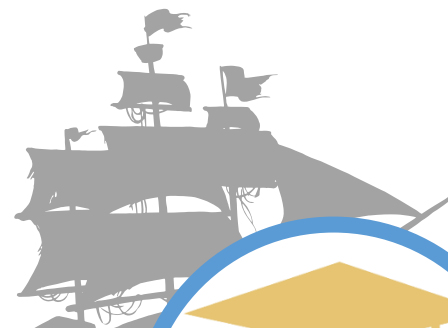

Notes about the literature/History sequence and Transferring

Students must complete a 6 hour sequence in either history or literature:

Eng 251/252 – American Literature I & II

His 101/102 – Western Civilization I & II

Eng 261/262 – British Literature I & II

His 201/202 – United States History I & II

Eng 271/272 – World Literature I & II
