Readmission of service members

It is the policy of Chattahoochee Valley Community College that the College will promptly readmit a service member with the same academic status as he/she had when last attending the school or accepted for admission to the school. This requirement applies to any student who cannot attend college due to military service. The student must notify the College of his/her military service and intention to return to the College and report this information to the Office of the Registrar.

Paragraphs inserted on page 17 under introduction:
