Applications missing test scores will be considered incomplete.
	4. A minimum of 2.5 GPA for nursing required academic core courses. GPAs are calculated by Admissions and are utilized to determine program eligibility.
	5. A minimum of 2.5 cumulative high school GPA for applicants without prior college courses. (GED will be used if applicable).
	6. Meet essential functions for nursing. Essential Functions form has been read and signed by applicant, acknowledging understanding and confirming ability to meet essential functions and technical standards for nursing with or without reasonable accommodations.
	7. Eligible for ENG101, MTH100 or higher, and BIO201 in spring 2023. Applicants may be CONDITIONALLY accepted if not eligible for one or more of these courses by application deadline; however, official transcripts or test scores reflecting eligibility must be received by Admissions prior to first day of spring 2022 classes.
	Unofficial transcripts for prior college coursework, including coursework completed at CVCC, must be attached to the nursing application and submitted prior to March 31, 2023. Submitted unofficial transcripts must reflect the coursework completed at that particular institution. Transcripts reflecting accepted transfer credit may not be submitted to meet unofficial transcript requirement. CVCC Admissions does not provide copies of transcripts. Applications missing unofficial transcripts from each college attended will be considered incomplete.

THE ALABAMA COLLEGE SYSTEM NURSING PROGRAM ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Physical, cognitive, psychomotor, affective and social abilities- in unique combinations- are functions that are essential to provide safe and effective nursing care. In order to be admitted, progress, and graduate from a nursing program, students must be able to meet the essential functions with or without reasonable accommodations throughout the course of their program. They must possess a functional level of ability to perform the duties required of a nurse.

Admission or progression may be denied if a student is unable to demonstrate the essential functions with or without reasonable accommodations. If an individual's health changes during the program of learning, so that the essential functions cannot be met with or without reasonable accommodations, the student will be withdrawn from the nursing program. The nursing faculty reserves the right at any time to require an additional medical examination at the student's expense in order to assist with the evaluation of the student's ability to perform the essential functions.

The essential functions delineated below are those deemed necessary by the Alabama Community College System nursing programs for the provision of safe and effective nursing care. No representation regarding industrial standards is implied. Similarly, any reasonable accommodations made will be determined and applied to the respective nursing program and may vary from reasonable accommodations made by healthcare employers. The nursing programs and/or its affiliated clinical agencies may identify additional essential functions. The nursing programs reserve the right to amend the essential functions as deemed necessary.

ACCREDITATION

Chattahoochee Valley Community College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award the Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, and Associate of Applied Science degrees. While an individual may meet the educational qualifications, final approval to take the licensure examination and become licensed is subject to action by the Alabama Board of Nursing or other applicable nursing regulatory body. Additionally, completion of nursing coursework does not guarantee acceptance into any higher-level nursing program. Acceptance into higher-level programs is contingent upon the program and institution policies for which the student is applying.

ELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSURE

Legal requirements for licensure in the State of Alabama are listed in the Alabama Board of Nursing Administrative Code. The Alabama Board of Nursing determines the eligibility for licensure based on the applicant's response to certain questions. It is important that you understand that successful completion of the nursing program does not guarantee eligibility to take the NCLEX exam. The Board of Nursing may deny an individual permission to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) based on an investigation. Applicants do not need to respond to the questions for application to the program, but must be aware that when applying for licensure they must answer the questions honestly or risk denial of application for licensure.
