YEAR THREE TASKS

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Expand and enhance academic programs to meet the needs of underprepared students to promote enrollment, retention, completion and transfer.

- Increase the number of students participating in Pirate Prep with a goal to become college ready in English and Math.
- Ensure that students are registered for 15 credit hours each semester.
- Assign high-risk students to a Success Coach.

Expand and enhance student services to engage students and increase retention and persistence.

- Increase the number of subjects available for in-person tutoring.
- Improve success rates of of students enrolled in developmental English and Math.
- Increase opportunities for work-based learning/internships for all students.

Expand professional development to support enhancements to student services and reinforce active engagement of faculty and staff.

- Train faculty and staff on student support services, the early alert process, classroom engagement and best practices to support student retention.
- Train faculty and staff in the areas of academic mindset, student engagement, and career awareness.

The Career Services Center Hosts Its First Career Fair

In March, Career Services Month was observed and students were offered various events each week to access resources for career development. The month kicked off with a professional headshot photo session by Michelle Howard, a local photographer.

The Career Services Center organized a resume workshop using the Career Coach platform to guide students in crafting or enhancing their resumes. Success Coaches conducted mock interviews to prepare students for job opportunities.

The culmination of Career Services Month was a career fair open to all students and the community, in partnership with Goodwill of the Southern Rivers Career Center. 
Financial Literacy Workshops

A workshop titled "Money Madness" was held to educate students on maintaining good academic standing to retain eligibility for financial aid. The session covered topics such as full-time credit hours, GPA requirements, and the consequences of deviating from the degree plan.

During the "Financial Common-Sense" seminar, students were provided guidance on applying for scholarships. They were instructed on how to navigate the college website to locate and apply for scholarships, as well as given tips on securing scholarships from community and online sources. Additionally, a video showcasing commonly used scholarship search websites was presented.

In another workshop within the series, Financial Aid Specialist Joshua Martin led a session focusing on common financial mistakes made by students. The workshop offered advice on making wise financial decisions during college, including the importance of having a bank account and tips on managing funds received throughout the semester.
